

On Sunday, June 23, 1991, the Japanese American Service Committee (JASC) celebrated its 45th Anniversary at the Heiwa Terrace, a senior citizen's apartment complex, built and sponsored by JASC.

This was a momentous occasion. It was 45 years ago that a dedicated group of Japanese old-timers met with some of the leaders among former internees who had been released from internment centers where they had been held since 1942 by the United States government after the start of World War II in the Pacific. These early leaders founded the organization then known as the Chicago Resettlers Committee to help the evacuees to find employment and living quarters in Chicago.

A few of these leaders like Rev. Gyomay Kubose are still active in our community. Others who were among the founders are still involved with JASC in serving Japanese Americans, their alien parents and their offsprings, the Sansei and Yonsei.

Our community is extremely fortunate that leaders like former JASC presidents Tom Teraji and Noboru Honda, as well as other long-time members such as Betty Nakanishi, Mary Koga, Dorothy Kaneko and others are still serving on either the Board or on the various committees of our agency. The lifeline of the agency has been all the volunteers who participate in so many of the agency's programs...Market Day, Christmas Delight, Health Fair, Fuji Festival, Adult Day Care, Nutrition Program and many others.

Our JASC Board of Directors has been the mainstay of so many of our programs along with the great support we have received from so many of our community organizations...Chicago Nisei Post 1183, New Horizons members, church groups, both Christian and Buddhist and from the Futabakai Japanese School PTA members.

Our Long Range Planning Committee, chaired by Betty Nakanish, has focused on health care for our JASC members and other people in our community as a priority item. With our highly successful JASC-sponsored Heiwa Terrace Senior Housing Project having celebrated its 11th an-

niversary this year, JASC after a 10-year campaign has finally started construction of our long-awaited 180 bed JASC Keiro Nursing Home.

Looking ahead, the construction and operation of the Keiro Nursing home will be the greatest challenge of JASC in the next two years. More important, we have to raise \$700,000 to cover start-up costs for the home during its first two years of operation. The fund drive has already started and I can only hope that it will be as successful as our initial fund-raising campaign which resulted in approximately \$1.3 million. This money was used to pay for the land and for the services of various consultants in the nursing home field.

We look forward to the future with confidence and with a conviction to conquer the challenges which face us.

We closed FY 1991 with a celebration of the 45th Anniversary of the Japanese American Service Committee. Only a handful of people among the original organizers are still alive and the JASC itself has gone through many changes, in response to the increasing and changing needs of the Japanese American community.

Our organization walked together with 20,000 Japanese Americans who ventured out from the war-time concentration camps to an unfamiliar midwestern city 45 years ago. The Agency shared with the community hardships as well as achievements, and the agency has been a vital member of the Japanese American Community for four-and-a-half decades. The continuous support we receive from the community attests to that fact.

FY 1991 marks another significant accomplishment for JASC. The long arduous task of obtaining approval from the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the construction of our Keiro Nursing Home finally took place this year after a five-year effort. The approval made as fiscal year 1991 closed, led to construction of the facility starting at the beginning of FY 1992.

In 15 months, the long awaited dream of the Japanese American Community...Keiro...should become a reality. The contribution toward this from our people has been phenomenal. Already \$1.3 million has been raised during the last three years from a relatively small community of Japanese Americans and others who believe in our cause.

Enthusiastic response to further fund raising appeal will be a positive indication of the whole hearted support of the need of Keiro Nursing Home in Chicago.


Throughout the year the JASC continued its services in response to the needs of the community. The agency has continued providing Casework Counseling, Home Help Service, Adult Day Care, and Group Services (classes on culture and arts and nutrition services.)

The Community Nurse Program, which was initiated in the previous year, was fully implemented in FY 1991 with the employment of

a project nurse and participation of five Christian and Buddhist churches. Outreach programs on preventive medicine and health maintenance education have begun.

We are eternally grateful to the founders and forerunners of the JASC who saw the needs of such organization and to those who in a very difficult time laid the foundation for us to serve the Japanese American community. We are thankful for the leaders of JASC who succeeded to founders' spirit and ideals and made the JASC greater.

I am privileged to be a part of an agency which has provided many services in the past 45 years, and now is establishing a second monument for the community...the Keiro Nursing Home.

Events, some of a lasting impact, crowded the last fiscal year, making it a memorable one in the JASC history.

First and foremost there was the 45th Anniversary of an organization which from a small agency founded in 1946 with a budget of \$9,000 has grown to where it stands today, serving a Japanese American community of many thousands. The observance of the anniversary was a happening and a celebration, highlighted by a ceremony at the Heiwa Terrace on Sunday, June 23. It featured a slide show spanning the first 35 years of JASC existence, a script outlining the past 10 years of achievement and a multitude of awards to those who have helped JASC through the years. An overflow crowd attended the event.

Then there was a dream which last year became a reality. During the past fiscal year we gained final approval from HUD to start the construction of the Keiro Nursing Home. The approval came in the waning days of the fiscal year and construction of the facility, which has been in works for a decade, began in July.

Our "Parish" or Community Nurse Program was started last year with the hiring of a community nurse in conjunction with the Swedish Covenant Hospital. The nurse works with the congregations of five Christian and Buddhist churches, as well as with other members of the Japanese American community.

A number of special events also highlighted the year. These included the Fuji Fes-

tival which honored Mary Koga, one of the earliest members of JASC and the artist/photographer whose contributions made last year's Annual Report "The Quiet People" a resounding success.

Then there was the Christmas Delight Sale, the annual Market Day and others. These activities help us to raise funds needed to provide services to our clients.

We gained a new tenant in FY 1991. Search Developmental Center rented our former workshop space in the south end of our building. The organization plans to stay here until the end of this year.

Our list of Japanese corporations which became members of JASC, continued to grow with 38 companies joining us this year as compared to 31 in the previous year. Their names are found elsewhere in this issue.

There were other minor triumphs and achievements. It can be only concluded that FY 1991 was a good one for us.

The Japanese American Service Committee through the years has factored its programs to serve the changing needs of our client community. Presently, as the Issei population is fading fast, we are concentrating on services for the Niseis. Their health and what we can do to improve it is high on our agenda.

While we are concerned with the needs of the Niseis we also have to look at the future and anticipate the role the Sanseis (third generation Japanese Americans) will play in our organization. We hope that soon we will be able to provide some services to this generation, and possibly their children, the Yonsei (fourth generation Japanese Americans.) Service in the areas of maintaining their cultural heritage and introducing their children to it, appear as possibilities for programs for the Sanseis and Yonseis.

In fiscal 1991 we served our community with the following programs:

Our ADULT DAY CARE program served on the average 22 clients per day, totaling 26,180 hours of service. Adult Day Care aims to keep the elderly out of institutions and offers activities in a group setting which help older adults to improve their physical and mental condition. Clients participate in a number of activities and special events, such as field trips, ceramics, exercise and hear speakers on various subjects. They also get a noon meal (a total of 5,200 served to the Adult Day Care clients during the last year) and have the opportunity to eat together with others. Social service and nursing staffs develop individual plans for each client and monitor their progress.

CASEWORK AND COUNSELING services in the past fiscal year worked with 242

clients, 179 of Japanese American ancestry. The total hours of service provided were 2741.75. This is a program which assists clients to achieve adequate psychological and social life. The counselor speaks Japanese and deals with questions involving financial and health issues as well as formulating future plans for the elderly.

HOME SUPPORT services involve cleaning, shopping, laundry, food preparation, personal care, nutritional service and hygiene education to the elderly either at Heiwa Terrace, a senior citizen's residential center, or at other locations. This service has one aim -- to help the elderly live independently and avoid institutionalization.

During the past year, the chore housekeepers provided a total of 19,070 hours of service to 158 clients... 81 of them Japanese Americans. Fifty-six of the clients were Caucasians, five Black and 16 other Asians.

GROUP SERVICES is a program which provides educational classes, mature driving, Tai Chi (oriental exercise), Minyo (folk music and dance), origami (paper folding), kaminngyo (paper doll construction) and Japanese language class.

Special Japanese festivals are observed and presented as authentically as possible. Programs on health and education are presented by this division of JASC as well as well as city-sponsored nutrition and "Meals on Wheels" services to home-bound elderly. The nutrition program served 6,211 meals to 260 persons (excluding the Adult Day Care clients mentioned before), and provided duplicated group services to 1,026 persons, representing 16,841 hours.


